### 30 Rainbow Cloud

This 3D rainbow cloud is a perfect spring craft! The arched rainbow connecting two cotton ball clouds makes it more unique than your standard rainbow craft.



#### Materials:

Rainbow Colored Construction Paper White Construction Paper Scissors Cotton Balls Glue Bottle & Glue Stick Cloud Template (included)

#### Instructions:

1. If you don't want to have to cut out your own cloud shape for the cotton balls, print out the included cloud template and trace two clouds onto white construction paper; cut them out.

2. Take the rainbow colored construction paper and cut one strip from each, approximately 1/2 in. wide. If you do not have indigo colored paper, just use red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple.

> 3. Glue one end of each strip to the center of the cloud with the glue stick in rainbow order.

> > 4. Secure with tape.

5. Fold the clouds to create an arch.

6. Apply glue to the cloud and add cotton balls. Be

sure to place them underneath

the arch; this will help it hold its arched shape.

7. Complete the cotton balls on the other cloud as








well.

# Funfetti Chex Mix

## Ingredients:


6 cups Rice chex cereal
1/2 cup colored sprinkles
1 cup yellow or white cake mix
1/2 cup confectioners' sugar, or less to taste
12 oz white chocolate chips, chopped white chocolate bars, or white chocolate candy melts
1 tsp shortening or vegetable oil

## Directions:

1. Dump cereal in large bowl or pot.

- 2. In a separate bowl, combine the sprinkles, cake mix, and confectioner's sugar (less if you're not into sweet things) and stir to combine.
- 3. In a medium, microwave-safe bowl, heat white chocolate and shortening in 30 second increments, stirring well after each time (overheating will cause chocolate to harden).
- 4. Immediately pour the melted chocolate over the cereal mixture and stir gently to coat the cereal.
  - 5. Toss the sprinkles and cake mixture over the cereal and gently stir until evenly coated.
    6. Serve immediately, or cover and store in air tight container for up to two weeks.


## "Coforful" Read-Afouds for Kids




